	<i>When to Use</i>	<i>How to Test</i>
There	To name a place, a thing, or the existence of something	Replace “there” with “here”
Their	To show possession	Replace “their” with “our”
They're	To combine “they” and “are” (Makes a contraction)	Replace “they're” with “they are”

**Adjectives describe nouns
or pronouns.**

Example: That dog is **cute**.
Cute is describing the noun *dog*.

Adverbs

English

Adverbs are words that modify everything EXCEPT nouns and pronouns. A word is an adverb if it answers how, when or where.

Example: She spoke **quickly**.

How did she speak? She spoke *quickly*.

in a SERIES

A comma follows words and phrases in a series EXCEPT the last one.

Example: She got carrots, beets, flowers, and apples at the grocery store, from a street vendor and out of her mother's garden.

Commas:

Before CONJUNCTIONS

that join independent

CLAUSES

English

Conjunctions= FANBOYS
(for, and, not, but, or, yet, so)

An independent clause= a complete sentence!

Example:

I went to the store, and Sally stayed home.

Hint:

Get rid of prepositional phrases.

<i>Linking Verb</i>	<i>Singular or Plural</i>	<i>Example</i>
Is	Singular	One book with flowers and children on the cover is red.
Are	Plural	Two books for my English class are blue.
